School. It is named after Sir Syed Ahmed Khan to perpetuate the memory of the pioneer of Muslim Educational Movement in India. The Institute is purely secular, cosmopolitan and co-educational. The Institute celebrates its twenty first year of unmatched excellence in shaping careers and building lives.

Sir Syed Institute for Technical Studies is an unaided self-financing College affiliated to Kannur University. It started functioning in October 2002 and is in continuous pursuit of excellence and therefore provides quality education. It continues to make substantial progress every year, by way of its exemplary functioning. The Institute offers 4 PG courses in Computer Science, Biotechnology, Microbiology, Biochemistry and 13 UG courses in B.Sc. Computer Science, B.Sc. Microbiology, B.Sc. Biochemistry, B.Sc. Biotechnology, B.Sc. Psychology, B.Sc. Food Technology, B.Com Computer Application, B.Com Finance, B.Com Marketing, B.Com Co-operation, B.B.A, B.A English and B.A Economics. It proposes on adding many more courses in future academic years for the growth and betterment of the students and society. Admission to all the courses is subjected to merit and management following all the norms of reservations laid down by the Government. The college also offers Central Sector Scholarship and Post Metric Scholarship for Minorities. The Institute possesses outstanding infrastructure and state of the art facilities. It also holds a computerized reference library with a well updated bibliotheca and a well-resourced IT Department. The Institute holds well-equipped and matchless laboratories for the departments of Biotechnology, Microbiology, Biochemistry and Psychology that can easily keep pace with any of the modern research laboratories. Broadband access within the Institute is smooth and uninterrupted. The Institute also possesses a well-resourced seminar hall with video conferencing facility to conduct International and National Seminars and Webinars. The Institute owns adequate transportation system facilitating students in their conveyance.


The Institute provides individual hostel accommodations for both boys and girls. The ladies' hostel is in the college premises and therefore ensures a safe and secured environment for the girl students. As a requirement of the institution, separate prayer halls have been provided for Gents and Ladies. The college has a strength of about 1757 students, 73 teaching staffs and 21 ministerial staff. Our faculty includes four Ph.D bearers, four M.Phil degree bearers and several NET holders. Orientation programmes are regularly attended by our teachers to empower with the new norms and be updated with the educational system. We are proud to have several International publications to our credit and have two novel gene sequences deposited in the NCBI. We have an extensive library with 5148 books and 32 journals.

The Institute organises teachers training programmes on a regular basis to help teachers to keep pace with the current educational system. Our students have excelled in their fields of study and have various fellowships to their credit. The BIRAC fellowship attained by four of our students from Department of Biotechnology was a remarkable achievement for our Institution. Several International/National Seminars/Webinars. Training programmes, industrial visits and workshops have also been conducted for the students to achieve academic as well as to shape the overall development of the students. Tutorial system is well integrated into the educational system and guides the students in acquiring academic excellence by providing them individual attention and counselling. The students are continuously assessed on the basis of their academic as well as individual progress and the parents are intimated about the progress of their wards from time to time. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Collegiate Student Grievance Redressal Committee, Placement Cell, Ladies Association are functioning to rekindle the latent talents of students. The Institute also initiated a step towards a greener campus by constituting a Biodiversity Garden "BOTANICO".


The students are expected to come to the college in a prescribed uniform.

ADMISSION

All admissions to the Programs (UG & PG) have been made online with the Single Window System, through Kannur University Website.

Applicants provisionally selected for admission shall be enrolled only on the submission of all the necessary certificates in original and payment of the fees. The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission to any candidate without assigning any reason.

FEE COLLECTION

Tuition fee along with special fee and caution deposit should be paid in lumpsum at the time of admission. Students belonging to SC, ST and other eligible communities will have to pay the fees at the time of admission and later it will be re-imbursed on their application to the concerned authorities. The fee once collected will not be refunded under any circumstances. Students from other Universities shall pay the Matriculation and Recognition fee at the time of admission and apply for Recognition of the qualifying examination.

CAUTION DEPOSIT

- The caution deposit will be refunded (after deducting dues if any) to the students only after the completion of the course. They should produce the original receipt issued at the time of admission.
- All claims for refund of caution deposit shall be preferred before the re-opening date of next academic year.

TRANSFER CERTIFICATE

- Application for transfer certificate should be submitted in the prescribed form at least two days in advance.
- Conduct Certificate will be issued only along with the Transfer Certificate when the student completes the course.





- Modest dress code has always been the pattern of this Institution. The Management has introduced separate uniform for boys and girls. P.G. students are however exempted.
- 2. Students shall always behave with dignity and courtesy.
- When a teacher enters the class room, the students shall rise up and remain standing until the teacher takes his/her seat or ask them to be seated.
- 4. All students shall be in their respective class room before the scheduled time and students are not expected to come late.
- Students shall observe strict discipline while moving from one class to another and also during intervals. Students do not have freedom in entering others class rooms.
- 6. No meeting or entertainment shall be organized by the students without the written permission from the Principal.
- 7. Loitering in the corridors, causing disturbance in the class rooms and such undesirable indisciplinary activities are strictly forbidden.
- Absolute obedience is expected from every student. If anyone tries to defy/defame the authority of the Principal or any teacher or any other staff, he/she will be subject to disciplinary actions.
- 9. No students shall disfigure the Walls, Windows or Furniture/ Equipments by writing on them. If anyone damages or destroys the college property, he/she will have to pay the repair/reinstallation charges.
- Smoking, use of alcohol, or intoxicating drinks and consumption of drugs are strictly prohibited.
- 11. The behaviour of students both within and outside the college premises should be decent. No students shall leave the class room or laboratory without the permission of the teacher in-charge.

- 12. The following are not allowed inside the college campus. Those who violate the rules will be punished.
 - Publish any materials such as magazines, notices, journals, booklets etc. (during the College Union Election eve for canvassing vote) without the prior permission of the Principal.
 - To conduct meeting by the students inside the campus without the prior permission of the Principal.
 - To display any materials for publicity such as wall posters, banners, notices etc. within the campus.
 - Taking unauthorized collections from the students or staff.
 - Entering other class rooms when there is class or not obtaining prior permission before entering the class.
- 13. Bringing mobile phones or video cameras inside the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- 14. The Principal shall have the power to impose the following punishment: imposing fine, suspension and dismissal of students.

IDENTITY CARD COMPULSORY

Every member of the college (Teachers, Students, Ministerial staff) shall posses an identity card (with passport size photograph) issued by the college duly sealed and signed by the principal. All payments, issue of certificates, books shall be made only on the production of the identity card. The students shall produce their identity cards as and when the college staff demands. The identity card is valid only for three years. Keeping more than one identity card is punishable. In case of loss of identity card, duplicate identity card will be issued only with the recommendation of the teacher-in-charge on payment of a fine. The said Identity Card has to be worn round the neck in a pendant form.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

Each working day is divided into two sessions. The Fore-Noon session is of 3 periods and After-Noon session is of 2 periods, each of one hour duration. Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each period by the teacher-in-charge of the class. Every student shall have a minimum attendance of 75% in a semester. Students are not allowed to absent themselves from the classes without leave application. Leave application should be submitted to –

the Principal through the Class-Tutor/ Head of the Department. Application for leave on medical grounds shall be supported by a valid medical certificate. Absence from the college with or without leave for more than 5 consecutive working days shall be reported to the Principal before attending any class. If a student is absent for more than 14 consecutive working days without any intimation, his/her name will be removed from the roll. The hard copy of the online registration for University examination will not be forwarded to the University unless the Principal is satisfied that the student has the minimum attendance as per rules. Students who want to participate in the extra-curricular activities will not be granted grace attendance unless they obtain prior written permission from the Principal. Application for such permission shall be recommended by the concerned teacher.

MEMBERSHIP

All staff members and students who get admitted in the college will automatically become the members of the Library. The Library also welcomes Alumni, Students and Research Scholars of other Institutions to use Library resources with prior permission of Principal.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Identity Card is a must for Library entrance.
- No member shall keep books for more than a fortnight (14 days).
- Borrowed books should be returned on the due date stamped on the date label in the book.
- Absence from the college will not be a valid reason for delay in returning books.
- Loss of borrowed books/Library Cards have to be reported immediately in writing to the Librarian.
- · Members shall be liable to replace books lost or pay a fine to be fixed

- by the Librarian.
- No Combined Reference Work and discussion is to be done inside the Library.
- Books should be handled with great care. Mutilation of Books in any manner will be fined.
- Students are not allowed to exchange Library Books/Library Cards.
- Periodicals shall not be displaced from the tables.
- · Reference Books and Project Reports will not be lent out.
- · Mobile phones are strictly prohibited inside the Library.

- Always communicate to library staff about your needs.
- Maintain a queue at circulation counter.

- Admission to hostels is for one year only.
- Principal (Sir Syed College) is the chief warden, he is the final authority to grant admission/re-admission.
- Residents of the hostels shall strictly adhere to the directions/ rules framed by the college authorities. Violation of such rules will entail his/ her expulsion from the hostel /dismissal from the college.

HOSTEL RULES

- Students are accountable for their belongings. The hostel authorities will not be responsible for any loss of cash or other valuables from the room.

- Allotment of rooms is at the discretion of the Warden. Students should refrain from defacing walls and furniture with drawings and writings.
- The hostel warden has the right to check the room at any time for

maintaining order in the hostel.

- Students cannot bring outsiders into the hostel. Guest may be allowed on prior written permission from the warden.
- Consumption of alcohol, smoking and use of drugs and other intoxicants in the hostel and its premises are strictly prohibited. Anyone found violating the rules will be subjected to serious disciplinary action.
- Hostellers desiring to go out of the campus shall obtain permission from the warden before going out and register their details of movement in the movement register.
- Admission to the hostel is on an annual basis and may not be renewed for lack of compliance with the hostel discipline. Serious breach of hostel discipline will invite dismissal from college also.
